Day 1 – Palermo City (1/2) morning

City center walk between art and street markets 



Palermo. The capital of culture, life, and beauty

Palermo is a city that reached splendor in every stage of its history. Once referred to be as the most beautiful city of the Arab world, now it is listed for its UNESCO masterpieces of the Arab-Norman architecture.

The city is today a melting pot of cultures, and a truly capital of tolerance. That is easy to be noticed in its Arab Kalsa district. However, Palermo remains a deeply European, young and modern city.

What makes Palermo special is its street food, the incredible rich heritage and its gorgeous Mondello beach.

1. Start the tour with the impressive Palermo Cathedral and take the Church rooftop tour
2. Continue your stroll towards the Chiesa del Gesù
3. Head to the Ballarò Street Market for an entertaining walk across food stands and try some street food
4. Discover the Arab-Norman Palermo with the Church of San Cataldo and the Martorana in Piazza Bellini
5. Take a 360° view of Piazza Pretoria, over its Renaissance Fountain, the City Hall and the Churches of Santa Caterina and San Giuseppe
6. Move to the “Quattro Canti”, the iconic crossroad of the city where Via Maqueda and Via V. Emanuele intersect
7. Reach the Teatro Massimo (Opera House) and take a guided tour of the theater
8. Experience the lively atmosphere of the Capo Street Market and taste Palermo street food once again
9. Otherwise, walk in Via dell’Orologio until to find many popular restaurant options for lunch



Day 1 – Palermo City (2/2) afternoon



The Gulf and the “Conca d’oro”, the Golden Basin

Situated between the Tyrrhenian Sea in the north and very sharp mountains in the south, the Arab named the Valley of Palermo “Conca d’oro”, meaning the Golden Basin, as the city was surrounded by flourishing orange trees.

Mount Pellegrino dominates the Gulf and separates the city coastline ranging from the harbor to the residential beach district of Mondello.

Only 70 km north of Palermo lies Ustica, a volcanic island famous for its rich seabed, a paradise for scuba diving.

The Kalsa, the seaside and the city gardens walk

1. Restart the walk in the afternoon with the Church of San Domenico and its Convent
2. Continue the walk towards the Arab historical Kalsa District and stop in Piazza Sant’Anna to visit its Church
3. In Piazza dei Vespri, admire Palazzo Gangi Valguarnera, set of the movie “The Leopard”
4. Head to the Gothic Church of San Francesco, and stop at the historical Antica Focacceria San Francesco to taste some Palermo delicacies
5. Continue towards Palazzo Chiaramonte Steri, located on one side of the Giardino Garibaldi
6. Get down to Porta Felice, the iconic gate of the city
7. Reach the Botanical Garden for a visit before you stroll along the seaside at Foro Italico. Admire the view over the Gulf of Palermo and Mount Pellegrino
8. Walk to La Cala, the Marina at the Palermo harbor
9. Finish with La Vucciria Street Market, a lively area of the city center at night, full of restaurants and street artists
